 **Marlin Maddux '38** was the son of Otis and Jesse Maddux. He had two sons who also both graduated from GCHS (Duane '67 and Garry '74). Maddux served his community in all walks of life.

In the military, Maddux served in World War II in the European theater, earning a Purple Heart and Bronze Star. Maddux also served 23 years in the Indiana National Guard, retiring as Commanding Officer of the second battalion (Shelbyville).

In politics, Maddux was an active member of the local Republican Party and proudly served as mayor of Greensburg from 1960-64. Maddux was also a past president and member of the Rotary, Jaycees, New Horizons, and Decatur County Historical Society. Maddux was a longtime member of First Baptist Church where he served as a Sunday school teacher, deacon, and trustee.

Maddux was the owner and operator of Maddux Moving, Storage, and Auction Company, now in its 72<sup>nd</sup> year of business and home to one of the longest-running weekly consignment auctions in the state of Indiana. Maddux was inducted into the Indiana Auctioneer Hall of Fame in 1987.

 **John M. Ziegler '70** is a scientist and author born sometime in 1952-53 in Greensburg. Growing up in Greensburg, Ziegler had many interests including sports, agriculture, and science. He greatly enjoyed his summers at his grandfather's farms in Sandusky and the fishing breaks he had with him. Ziegler attended GCHS while doing research at Indiana University. Ziegler holds a B.A. in Chemistry from Wabash College and a Ph.D. in Organic Chemistry from the University of Illinois.

After graduating, Ziegler moved to Stamford, CT to be a researcher at the American Cyanamid Corporation. While in Connecticut, Ziegler was a key factor in the manufacturing of a low-cost, non-toxic pesticide. Ziegler then moved to Albuquerque, NM to be a part of the Sandia National Laboratories to do work with silicon-based polymers. As of now, Ziegler has invented 30 U.S. and
